Get Help when you need it at a VA VET CENTER

Just walk in and ask for help. That's how easy it is to access the services of the Department of Veterans Affairs' Vet Centers. All eligible veterans can use Vet Center Services at no-charge ;proof of military service is all you need and Vet Center personnel will even help you with that.

Vet Centers provide counseling for Vets in need of help for drug or alcohol abuse, post-traumatic stress disorder or any psychological issue. They help with employment & education. Vet Centers work in partnership with VA Medical Centers. If a Vet needs medical services he is referred to a VA Medical Center.
