Revision to Constitution and By-Laws

Article IV.

Article IV Section 4 and all subsequent article numbers will change in ascending order so that Article IV will contain 11 Sections.

Article IV Section 4 (Proposed)

Section 4. Duties of the Third Vice Commander

The Third Vice- Commander shall have responsibility as the coordinator and facilitator for post fund raising activities and programs including the timely application for permits and licenses.

Revision to the Constitution

Section 2.

(Existing) The Officers of this Post shall be a Commander. A First Vice Commander, a Second Vice Commander, A Post Adjutant, a Post Finance Officer, Post Judge Advocate, a Post Historian, a Post Chaplain, A Post Service Officer, a Sergeant-at-arms, and such other officers as may be deemed necessary by this organization, who shall be nominated from the Floor at the meeting preceding the annual Election.

Section 2.

(Proposed with editorial changes) The Officers of this Post shall be: Commander; First Vice Commander; Second Vice Commander; Third Vice Commander; Post Adjutant; Post Finance Officer; Post Judge Advocate; Post Historian; Post Chaplain; Post Service Officer; Sergeant-at-arms. Other officers as deemed necessary by this organization shall be nominated from the Floor at the meeting preceding the annual Election.

AUDITING PANEL

The Budget Committee recommends a change to Article VI of the by-laws to add an Auditing Panel. An Auditing Panel is recommended in the Post Operations Manual published by: Membership and Post Activities Committee, The American Legion, P.O. Box 1055, Indianapolis, Indiana 46206

Article VI – Committees

Section 5. This Post shall have an Auditing Panel, consisting of three members in good standing with a knowledge of accounting procedures, and shall be presented by the Nominating Committee and elected in accordance with Article VI-A of the Constitution of Synepuxent Post No. 166 . Members of the Auditing Panel may also be elected Officers of the Post. In the event that the committee has not been filled through the election process, the Executive Committee will assign members in good standing to the panel.

Article IV-Duties of Officers

This change to Article IV is necessary to have an annual budget included in the financial records of the Post. It will be the Commander's responsibility to present a budget to the membership for approval at the first meeting in October after the installation of officers.

Section 1. (Existing)

Duties of the Post Commander. It shall be the duty of the Post Commander to preside at all meetings of the Post and to have general supervision over the business and affairs of the Post. And such officer shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the Post. He shall approve all orders directing the disbursement of funds and shall make an annual report covering the business of the Post for the Year, and recommendations for the ensuing year, which shall be read at the annual meeting and a copy thereof immediately, forwarded to the Department Adjutant. He shall perform such other duties as directed by the Post.

Section 1 (Proposed with editorial changes).

Duties of the Post Commander. It shall be the duty of the Post Commander to preside at all meeting of the Post and have supervision over the business and operation of the Post. The Commander will be the Chief Executive Officer of the Post and approve all orders directing disbursement of funds. He will present a budget, for approval, to the general membership at the first meeting in October following the installation of officers. He will make an annual report to the general membership at the end of his term in office covering Post activities for the past year and make recommendations for the next administration. A copy of the report will be forwarded, in a timely manner, to the Department Adjutant. He will perform all duties as directed by the Executive Committee.
