## **Commander's Message**

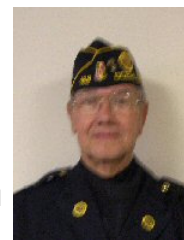

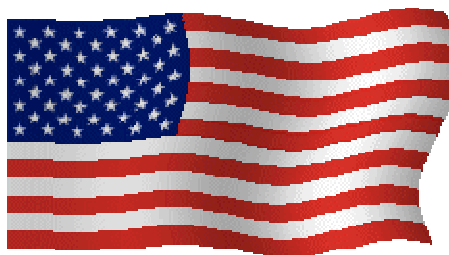

To accomplish our membership goal by becoming a three star post again this year, we will need the assistance and support and participation of our Post 166 membership. Last year, you , the members did a commendable job in recruiting new and transfer members. Your work resulted in Post 166 achieving the distinguished THREE STAR MEMBERSHIP AWARD.. We must strive to gain members prior to January 10, 2007, when the State and National Dues will rise to \$ 20.50 per member. Members we gain prior to that date means money in the Post 166 bank account. At mid December we had 726 members. We need 781 members to become eligible for the three STAR award.. We need each member to become part of the membership growth Committee. Please bring in new and transfer members in the time that remains during 2006, but no later than January 10..
